Principal's Message

Congratulations to all of our PSSA sporting teams who continue to demonstrate excellent behaviour and sporting ability as they represent the school. Parent Reminders Parking Around the School

From time to time I have parents contact me about other parents who are either breaking the law in relation to parking at the front and back of the school. We have limited parking around the school and it can be a challenge for parents to find somewhere to park to pick up their children. Please be considerate of other parents and abide by the laws which are signposted at the front and back of the school. In particular, the pick-up and drop-off zone at the front of the school, which is not zoned for parking. This is an area that needs improving by some parents. These parents are either leaving their cars unattended and entering the school or parking and waiting for some time. Last week we had the Council Ranger out the front of the school taking photographs and issuing fines for parking infringements. If you don't want a \$400 fine in the mail, please do the right thing.

Supervision of Students before 8.35am

Schools are not expected to provide supervision for students any earlier than the half hour before normal school classes commence in the morning. Students arriving at school prior to 8.35am must sit quietly outside the Library and wait for the teacher on duty. There are no teachers rostered on for formal supervision

prior to 8.35am. Parents need to be aware of this and should organise for their children to arrive at school between 8.35 and 9.05am, when classes commence. We seem to have a large number of students arriving by bike, scooter or walking, who get to school well before the school day commences.

Locking and Use of School Gates

During the course of the school day all gates will be locked for the safety of staff and students at 9.15am, with the exception of the pedestrian access gates at the front of the school. All pedestrian access gates will be reopened at approximately 2.45pm to allow parents access to pick up their children, and students to exit the school at the end of the day. Staff car parks will be locked at 8.45am and reopened after 3.05pm to restrict pedestrian movement through these traffic areas.

Behaviour of Students Travelling to and from School

Schools and parents have a responsibility to promote appropriate behaviour and the safety of students travelling to and from school. Students have a responsibility to behave in appropriate ways and to ensure both their own safety and that of other students. Students also have a responsibility community, school and parental meet expectations in this regard. Tanilba Bay Public School students should adhere to our 'Positive Learning' expectations when Behaviour for travelling to and from school. Be Safe, Do Your Personal Best, Be Friendly and Be Respectful. There will be consequences for poor behaviour travelling to and from school as per the 'TBPS Student Welfare Policy'. Teachers will support parents in developing appropriate standards of behaviour for students travelling to and from school and will communicate any concerns to parents as necessary.



School holidays are fast approaching, as this is a short nine week term. The holidays begin Monday Ist July and school resumes on Tuesday 16th July.


